Looking Back ... Looking Around ... Looking Ahead *A Personal Reflection*

Looking Back: The year – 1980. The place – the living room of our Methodist parsonage in Calvert County. The event – a lovely woman from our neighboring Episcopal church, Christ Church, Port Republic, dropped by to share her excitement after returning from a weekend that “changed her life”. This was my introduction to Cursillo.

Three years later, after our move into the Episcopal Church, my sponsor’s car pulled out of the driveway of the Curate’s house at St. Thomas Garrison Forest in Owings Mills with me in it, heading off to Maryland 15, and my own Cursillo journey began. Unfortunately, I was unable to complete that weekend for health reasons. (Don’t go to Cursillo 8 months pregnant!:) However, in the spring of 1985, my dauntless sponsors put me back in the car, along with my husband, and I very happily completed my Cursillo Weekend on Maryland 21.

It was for me as it was for my kindly friend: Cursillo changed my life, awaking God’s call and claim on my life, deepening my commitment to His church and giving me a means to love others and share His saving grace.

Looking Around: The year – 2011. Twenty six years, 10 teams, a rectorship and a few Secretariat positions later, Cursillo continues to change my life. Jesus’ promise to be where two or three are gathered in His Name is REAL and I have encountered Him in powerful, life altering ways every time it has been my privilege to gather with the Cursillo Community. Whether in grouping, team service on weekends, Ultreyas, sponsorship, regional Cursillo workshops, Eucharist or around the table at Secretariat meetings, the Lord has been among us, molding, shaping, embracing, and leading us as individuals and as a community into deeper commitment, to Him and to one another. It has led to a broadening of His call to serve in The Church and the world and woven an ever expanding web of holy friendships.

Looking Ahead: Maryland Episcopal Cursillo is alive and moving forward! Thanks to those who have come forward to serve and those who continue to support Cursillo with your prayers, gifts and participation, we continue with two weekends in 2011 and other opportunities that will, with God’s blessing, sustain and grow Cursillo in Maryland. Preparations for Maryland 100 under the faithful guiding hand of Chuck Rollhauser, MD 48, are well underway (check out the article in the soon-to-be published Spring addition of *The Maryland Church News!*). Marjie Mack, MD 63, has graciously accepted the call to be the rector of Maryland 101 to be held at the end of October. (Team applications needed!)

We have received both the blessing and the concrete support of Bishop Sutton as he has pledged to encourage clergy understanding and participation in Cursillo as well as his support for a diocesan-wide Cursillo Sunday which will occur sometime this fall. He is eager to be a part of our considerations as we move forward here in Maryland and has also committed to exploring re-establishment of the ties with the Cursillo communities in the Diocese of Easton and the Diocese Washington.

Christian Authenticity • The Heart of Evangelism

When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the mystery of God to you in lofty words or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling." (2 Corinthians 2:1-3)

Paul tells this young church that he did not come to them as a great philosopher with "lofty words or wisdom" but as a regular guy who knew nothing "except Jesus Christ, and him crucified" and he came in "weakness and in fear and in much trembling." Paul came to Corinth as a tent maker. Corinth was host to the Isthmian Games – the second largest competitive games in the ancient world (the largest being the Olympics). The well-to-do of Corinth would purchase tents to shade themselves while watching the games from the stands. Paul had a perfect market for his tents in Corinth, and we can imagine as he worked on tents and talked to customers, Paul would find ways to share his faith with co-workers and clients. Paul encountered people through his every day life and work and found ways to "make a friend, be a friend and bring a friend to Christ."

This Epiphany season we hear Paul's words to the Church in Corinth. The Corinthians could be described as Paul's "troubled children" in the faith. An ancient Greek proverb said the "trip to Corinth was not for the weak of heart." It was a thriving and prosperous city on the Isthmus of Corinth— a narrow 2.5 mile strip of land separating the Aegean Sea from the Mediterranean Sea. In Paul's time, merchant ships loaded with goods moving between Rome and the east would portage their ships across the isthmus to avoid the dangerous route around the Peloponnesian peninsula.

The Corinthians became quite wealthy from the fees collected for the movement of goods. The people became quite prosperous and a thriving artisan and merchant class arose leading to a strong class consciousness in the region. The Corinthians were rather well-educated and had a great appreciation for philosophy and rhetoric. The Corinthians were the "upwardly mobile" professionals of their day. Paul reminds us that Christian authenticity is the heart of evangelism. It's not about having "lofty words" or "wisdom." It is about having a living relationship with Christ, letting that relationship shape us into Christ-like people, and being willing to tell others what difference Christ makes in our lives.

We belong to Christ and this makes each of us a "living gospel." We often think the gospels are the four written testimonies of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. We forget that the gospel is still being proclaimed by each and every one of us as we live our faith in ordinary words and deeds— as we "make a friend, be a friend, and bring a friend to Christ." Money Matters • Green Palanca

The year just ended 2010 was not an easy one for Maryland Episcopal Cursillo; we had to postpone a Weekend, there was a turnover in the senior leadership, and we suffered a financial loss. At the end of 2009, we had \$12,537 in funds on hand, but by the end of 2010 that amount had fallen to only \$8,386, a dollar loss in excess of \$4,000.

Our expenses were somewhat reduced because we had only a single Weekend, but our income dropped dramatically in 2010. In both 2008 and 2009, MEC had income of more than \$20,000 each year, but in 2010 that amount fell to only \$11,600 – this drop in income accounts for the dramatic loss in our financial position.

Maryland Episcopal Cursillo has income from basically three sources: (1) Weekend fees, (2) collections at gatherings (e.g., Ultreyas, 4th day workshops), and (3) pledges and donations. In 2009, MEC received about \$7,000 in pledges and donations. However, in 2010 pledges and donations dropped drastically, and we collected only some \$2,200. Moreover, our income from Ultreyas has dropped steadily, also.

So this note serves as a reminder that we need to continue our financial support of Maryland Cursillo, to urge faithful active Cursillistas, to the extent that they are able, to continue their financial support. We will almost certainly do an direct financial appeal later this year.

A Statement from the National Episcopal Cursillo, May 2008

Cursillo has always kept its eyes firmly focused on Jesus and on the Mission. One of the principles of the Cursillo movement is that:

We focus on Christ and His resurrection power in our lives, transforming us into the people He would have us be. Theological disputes and political issues have no part in our agenda.

The Cursillo Movement is a movement that brings together all people, whether they might consider themselves to have a liberal or conservative Christian philosophy or somewhere in between, for the common good of promoting Jesus Christ and God's Mission. It is Christ-centered and Christ-focused. The Policy of the National Episcopal Cursillo Committee is that it will not be an organization with a political or social agenda. National Episcopal Cursillo is a movement of the Episcopal Church.

We recognize, however, that a number of individuals with connections and interest in the Episcopal Cursillo Movement are no longer affiliated with the Episcopal Church. As a sign of reconciliation, we welcome those still able, as individuals, to be in communion with the local Episcopal Diocesan Bishop and fellow Cursillistas, whether lay or ordained, to participate in the activities of the Cursillo Movement. Furthermore, and always at the Diocesan Bishop's discretion, we encourage an openness to their continued participation and interest in the activities of the Episcopal Cursillo. It should be understood by all that as a part of their participation, they agree to do so fully for the advancement of Cursillo, be supportive of the mission of Episcopal Cursillo, and agree that they will not promote any political agenda.

What is clear is that National Episcopal Cursillo was created to serve the Episcopal Church in the United States, and we are licensed by the Roman Catholic Church to do that. Despite our personal theological and political views, we are focused on knowing Christ and making Him known to others. That is our call and in doing it lays our greatest joy. *Ultreya! Ultreya!!* Let us get on with the day's apostolic action. Let us all pray for the Church and one another everyday.





