
Romans 12:11 Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord.

You get to meet friends, eat good food, and study something about God! It's all good!



It was also an opportunity to praise God. Praising God is not just a feeling. Praising God is a conscious activity. I am always reminded of that story about the man who "used to complain about having no shoes, until he saw a man with no feet."

The Psalms are full of God's command to praise. Praising God gives us the strength to look beyond our human shortcomings. Let us be conscience of why we praise God!

### Living Out My Fourth Day as a Green Shepherd

Since my Cursillo weekend (Maryland 94), I have explored and enjoyed a variety of servant roles in the church I attend, Church of the Transfiguration Braddock Heights (Vestry member, Lay Eucharistic Minister, Lector, Choir Member, Teller), as well as in the Episcopal Diocese of Maryland (Commission on Ministry, Maryland Episcopal Environmental Partners - MEEP, Horizons).

But, where I find myself truly called to action is as a Diocesan Green Shepherd. This is where I can be part of a larger team of people who care about the environment and want to help others to make a difference in their everyday lives. I remember feeling a call as early as the first Earth Day I experienced – THE first Earth Day in 1970! I wasn't sure what caring for the earth had to do with my religious upbringing, but I knew that St. Francis had already paved the way towards that ethos, and I was incredibly humbled to be able to pay homage to him when I visited Assisi several years ago.

When I first joined the Episcopal Church, I was thrilled to see a statue of St. Francis in the gardens around our parish hall, and I knew I was among kindred spirits. Nowadays, Creation Care is infused in our church services and religious education classes, but as individuals and as a society, we still have some difficult choices to make to ensure a livable future for generations to come. As a Green Shepherd, I have committed to keeping abreast of green initiatives in the Episcopal Diocese of Maryland (such as our current collaboration with the DE-MD Lutheran Synod to plant 500 Trees for the 500th Year of the Reformation), as well as in the state of Maryland (by attending Episcopal Advocacy Day at the State House in Annapolis, when the General Assembly is in Session).

Those things are actually a little bit easier than my biggest role as a Green Shepherd: to effect change in my own congregation by asking the hard questions about whether we should go to solar energy, or choose a power company that includes more wind and solar, or whether we should avoid serving paper and plastic products at our hospitality or fellowship events, for example. MEEP has made a call for at least one Green Shepherd per congregation, and if this is something that appeals to you in your Fourth Day as a leadership role in your own congregation, please let me know (broche@loyola.edu) and I'll be sure to get you started as a Green Shepherd of the Episcopal Diocese of Maryland.

### A Statement from the Episcopal Cursillo Ministry (ECM)



#### A Statement from the National Episcopal Cursillo, May 2008

Cursillo has always kept its eyes firmly focused on Jesus and on the Mission. One of the principles of the Cursillo movement is that: We focus on Christ and His resurrection power in our lives, transforming us into the people He would have us be. Theological disputes and political issues have no part in our agenda.

The Cursillo Movement is a movement that brings together all people, whether they might consider themselves to have a liberal or conservative Christian philosophy or somewhere in between, for the common good of promoting Jesus Christ and God's Mission. It is Christ-centered and Christ-focused. The Policy of the National Episcopal Cursillo Committee is that it will not be an organization with a political or social agenda. National Episcopal Cursillo is a movement of the Episcopal Church.

We recognize, however, that a number of individuals with connections and interest in the Episcopal Cursillo Movement are no longer affiliated with the Episcopal Church. As a sign of reconciliation, we welcome those still able, as individuals, to be in communion with the local Episcopal Diocesan Bishop and fellow Cursillistas, whether lay or ordained, to participate in the activities of the Cursillo Movement. Furthermore, and always at the Diocesan Bishop's discretion, we encourage an openness to their continued participation and interest in the activities of the Episcopal Cursillo. It should be understood by all that as a part of their participation, they agree to do so fully for the advancement of Cursillo, be supportive of the mission of Episcopal Cursillo, and agree that they will not promote any political agenda.

What is clear is that National Episcopal Cursillo was created to serve the Episcopal Church in the United States, and we are licensed by the Roman Catholic Church to do that. Despite our personal theological and political views, we are focused on knowing Christ and making Him known to others. That is our call and in doing it lays our greatest joy. Ultreya! Ultreya!! Let us get on with the day's apostolic action. Let us all pray for the Church and one another everyday.



#### **Weekend, MD 113, will be held April 19-22, 2018**

The Weekend Rector will begin the process of calling the team in the next few months. If you are a member of *Maryland Episcopal Cursillo* and have never served on a team, or would like to serve again, please consider submitting your team application!

Serving on a Weekend Team is a very rewarding experience and a special blessing!

#### A Cursillista (Lay or Clergy) wishing to serve on a Weekend Team should:

- $\sqrt{}$  Have attended a **4th Day workshop**; and
- $\sqrt{}$  Be active in the **4th Day** by regularly attending Ultreyas, participating in Group Reunion, and supporting and attending Las Mañanitas and Clausura when possible.

#### **Guidelines for Weekend Team Membership**

- Weekend Rectors select team members from Cursillistas who have submitted a <u>Team Application</u>
- Applications for serving on a Weekend Team will be valid until such time as the Cursillista has been selected and served on a Cursillo Team, *or* for 3 years, whichever comes first.
- A Cursillista may elect to submit a <u>new application</u> at any time the information reflected on his/her application changes.
- Currently, the team fee is \$265.00. This covers *only* The Claggett Center room and board. Team fees can vary, and will be confirmed prior to your accepting the call to serve.

Cursillistas selected to serve on a Weekend Team should not sponsor a candidate for the same weekend on which they are serving on team. Spouses or fiancées of Cursillo team members should not be a candidate on the same weekend on which the team member is serving on team.


